Stipa kotuchovii M. Nobis, nom. nov., must replace *S. monticola* Kotuch. 1998, which is an illegitimate name as a younger homonym of *S. monticola* H. Scholz 1993.

***Stipa kotuchovii* M. Nobis¹, nom. nov.**

TYPONYM: *Stipa monticola* Kotuch., Turczaninowia 1(1): 11. 1998, *nom. illeg.* (*non Stipa monticola* H. Scholz, Willdenowia 23: 117. 1993).

ETYMOLOGY: The species name honours the eminent Kazakh botanist Yuri A. Kotukhov (Lat.: Ju. A. Kotuchov).

Kotukhov (1998) described a new feather grass species named *Stipa monticola*, based on a specimen from the Saur Mts. in Kazakhstan. He overlooked that the binomen had already been used by Scholz (1993) for a species from Vermion Massif in Greece, and according to McNeill *et al.* (2006), *Stipa monticola* Kotuch. is an illegitimate later homonym of *Stipa monticola* H. Scholz. The Asian feather grass species thus needed a new name.

The two species belong to two different sections of *Stipa*. Kotukhov's species belongs to the section *Leiostipa*, whereas the species described by Scholz belongs to the section *Stipa*. Both of these taxa are treated as endemic (Scholz 1993, Kotukhov 1998, 2002).
