

## *Onobrychis tabrizensis*, nom. nov. (Fabaceae)

*Onobrychis tabrizensis* Negaresh, nom. nov., replaces *O. aurea* Ranjbar, Amirab. & Ghahrem. 2004, which is an illegitimate name as a younger homonym of *O. aurea* Boiss. ex Tchich. 1860.

***Onobrychis tabrizensis* Negaresh, nom. nov.**

Boiss. ex Tchich. The Asian legume species thus needed a new name.

TYPONYM: *Onobrychis aurea* Ranjbar, Amirab. & Ghahrem., *Willdenowia* 34: 187. 2004, nom. illeg. (non *Onobrychis aurea* Boiss. ex Tchich., *Asie Mineure, Description Physique, Statistique et Archéologique, III<sup>me</sup> Partie, Botanique* 1: 104. 1860).

ETYMOLOGY: The specific epithet refers to Tabriz city, where the taxon was found.

Ranjbar *et al.* (2004) described as new a legume species they named *Onobrychis aurea*, based on a specimen from the Khajeh submountains in Iran. They overlooked that the binomen had already been used by de Tchihatcheff (1860), and according to McNeill *et al.* (2011), *Onobrychis aurea* Ranjbar, Amirab. & Ghahrem. is an illegitimate later homonym of *Onobrychis aurea*
